

PU CARE AND MAINTENANCE
Australian Standards AS2687-1997

Do NOT use detergents, solvents abrasives, non-recommended PU cleaners.

Do NOT dry clean or machine wash. Protect from direct sunlight and heat sources, both direct and through heating vents.

Vacuum regularly with the soft brush attachment of the vacuum cleaner to remove dust and grit, then wipe with a soft, colourfast cloth dampened with plain water. This should be done as often as necessary or at least every 2-3 weeks.

When cleaning PU do not rub excessively or too hard.

Always let the product do the work and adhere to the manufacturers instructions.

Use only a soft, colour fast or white cloth sponge.

Special note - The salts and body oils which occur naturally in human skin can damage the surface of the PU if left unclean for lengthy periods. In warm or humid weather it is important that PU be wiped over weekly, particularly if the PU has become damp with perspiration or deposits of body oils are visible on areas such as head rests or arm rests and other areas of the furniture that comes in contact with the body.

Always clean along any creasers that have developed in the PU and pay particular attention to areas that are come in contact with the skin.

Deterioration due to incorrect or inadequate maintenance including deterioration caused by body oils, hair spray, gel mousse, perfume, deodorants, medication and dye penetration from clothes, cannot be considered a fault in the PU and claims due to this will not be considered.
